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Executive Summary



Financial Overview

The RSD has \$564 million in open contracts for the capital program after issuing \$505 thousand in new contracts, change orders and amendments in March. In addition, the total change orders to date, \$10 million, account for one percent (1.87%) of the total open construction contracts. RSD anticipates issuing approximately \$637 thousand in construction contracts/change orders, and \$1.5 million in professional service contracts/amendments in April

The OPSB has \$232 million in open contracts for the capital program after issuing \$775 thousand in new contracts, change orders and amendments in March. In addition, the total change orders to date, \$9.3 million, account for approximately four percent (4.74%) of the total open construction contracts. OPSB anticipates issuing approximately \$0 thousand in construction contracts/change orders and \$96 thousand in professional service contracts and amendments in April.

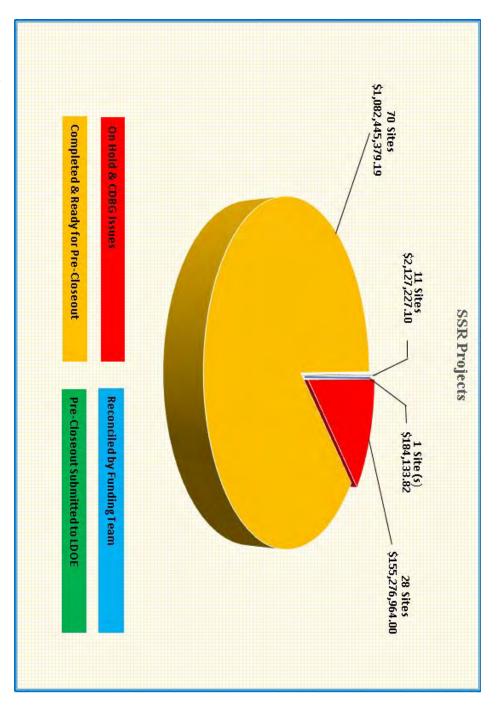
RSD Closeout Status

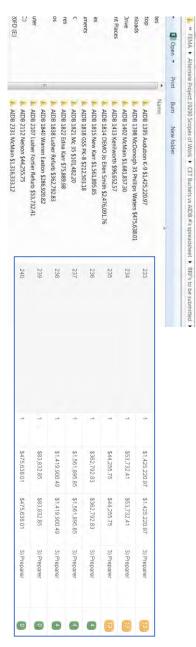

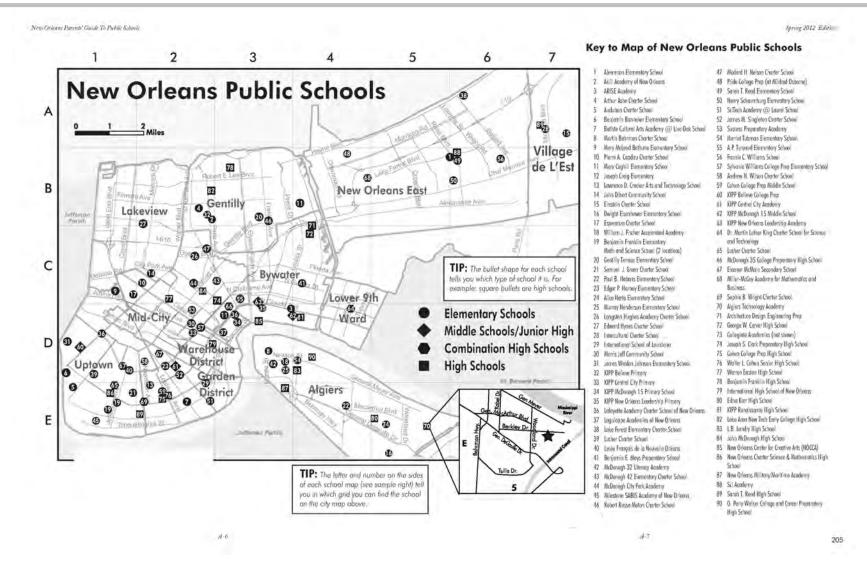


Appendix C School Map
